## **ST. JOHNLAND MILESTONES**

Kings Park, NY – February 13, 2006 – **St. Johnland Nursing Center** has celebrated two important milestones with receptions attended by former patients, doctors, social workers, therapists and staff. The Head Injury Rehabilitation Unit marked its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It is the only NYS Department of Health-certified inpatient program on Long Island and offers a full program of physical, occupational speech, cognitive and neuropsychology therapies. The reception was preceded by a presentation by Dr. Max Rudansky on sports-related head injuries.

The new Livingston Pavilion for Subacute Care celebrated a one-year anniversary. Offering short-term rehabilitation and complex medical care for treatment of patients recovering from accidents, injury, surgery or illness following hospitalization, the 24-bed dedicated unit provides comprehensive medical, nursing and social programs.

## **ST. JOHNLAND “MEMORIES”**

Kings Park, NY – March 1, 2006 – **St. Johnland Nursing Center** is taking advantage of a unique art program sponsored by The Alzheimer’s Association of Long Island called “Memories in the Making” that offers an approach to art expression for those diagnosed with Alzheimer’s or dementia. Many of these people can no longer communicate with their family or caregiver but find art a safe, non-judgmental way to express themselves and renew self-esteem and sociability.

Begun in 1988, “Memories in the Making” allows Alzheimer’s patients to paint memories or emotions that they are no longer able to talk about. The group meets with a trained professional on a regular basis. The art work is displayed at shows organized by both **St. Johnland** and the Alzheimer’s Association.

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
