Staten Island Care Center, a 300 bed facility located in Staten Island, NY is primarily an in-patient facility specializing in short term rehabilitation.

I am told there are 11 rehabilitation centers on Staten Island. Over the past years, I have visited several of them, so it was time for an appointment with the Staten Island Care Center. The director of admissions, Rosemarie Mandart, was most hospitable.

At first glance, it looks like a very small building tucked into a hill, hardly noticeable from the street.

What a surprise!

I entered a five-story, 300-bed building, remodeled quite recently, filled with friendly people, clean and nicely furnished. I repeatedly heard the motto of the administration: "SI Care Center, where everyone is a caregiver."

On a tour, my guide introduced me to many of the staff and I was able to enter into conversation with them, focusing on their particular specialty. The following is a condensed version of what I learned.

Staten Island Care Center is primarily an in-patient facility. Residents are there either for short-term rehabilitation following a hospital stay or illness at home, for short-term respite care or for a long-term stay. The service offered is called skilled nursing care.

"What we do best is short-term rehabilitation. Frail and elderly have a much better success rate in a smaller facility than in a larger facility because we focus on them more individually." Rosemarie commented.

THERAPY STAFF'S ROLE

Robert LoPorcaro took time out to describe the role of the therapy staff.

"For the short-term resident, the focus is on helping them arrive at the point where they can safely go home -- to cook safely, shower, get in and out of a tub safely, toilet themselves. We will do a verbal screening and if the family is very supportive and understanding, we work with that.

Are you looking for a place? Just drop in. I have been told you will be welcome at any time. Bring your questions with you.
